Doug Lichtman is a Professor of Law at the University of Chicago, School of Law, and an expert on intellectual property and telecommunications regulation. Lichtman's research has been featured in the Journal of Law & Economics, the Journal of Legal Studies, and the Harvard Business Review. He is co-author of Telecommunications Law and Policy, a casebook on the federal regulatory regimes applicable to broadcast television, radio, cable, telephone, and the Internet. He is also now an Editor at the Journal of Law & Economics.

Lichtman has given invited talks at numerous conferences and institutions, including Harvard, Yale, Stanford, NYU, Duke, Chicago, and the University of California at Berkeley. He also regularly writes in the popular press (recent pieces have appeared in the Wall Street Journal and Regulation Magazine) and comments on public events for news organizations such as NPR, CNN, and the Chicago Tribune.
