

HON. MARK L. WOLF was appointed as a U.S. District Judge for the District of Massachusetts in 1985. He is a graduate of Yale College and the Harvard Law School. Prior to his appointment to the District Court, Judge Wolf was an associate in the Washington, D.C. law firm of Surrey, Karasik & Morse (1971-74); a Special Assistant to the Deputy Attorney General of the United States (1974); A Special Assistant to the Attorney General of the United States (1975-77); an associate and then a partner in the Boston law firm of Sullivan & Worcester (1977-81); and Deputy United States Attorney for the District of Massachusetts (1981-85).

Judge Wolf serves on the Judicial Conference Criminal Rules Committee. He previously served on its Codes of Conduct and Criminal Law Committees. Judge Wolf has been a Lecturer at the Harvard Law School and an Adjunct Professor at the Boston College Law School. Judge Wolf is the Chairman of the Albert Schweitzer Fellowship, the Chair of the John William Ward Public Service Fellowship for Boston Latin School Students, and the Co-Chair of the Judge David S. Nelson Fellowship. He has also conducted programs to promote the development of independent judiciaries and respect for human rights in China, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Hungary, Turkey, Cyprus, and Egypt. In 2002, Judge Wolf received the Boston Bar Association's Citation of Judicial Excellence.
